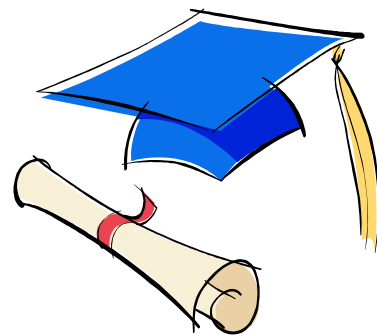
Congratulations to the 2006 High School graduates. Michael May, Jason Hubner and Marie Buckner. Best of luck with all your future plans. May all your dreams come true.

I also want to thank the cooking helpers: Gary, Brian, Tony, Rich, Ralph and Larry (I hope I did not miss anyone). I could not have prepared the kabobs and breakfast without their help. I also want to give a special note of thanks to Gary and Louise Knapp for assisting with the food preparation and transportation and of course my great first mate Jackie!

Next up is Mitchell's Bay on June 9th. Remember this is a theme outing, so bring your Hawaiian gear. Mitchell's Bay Marina is hosting dinner; pig roasts, corn on the cob and baked potatoes. There will be hot dogs for the kids. Your dish to pass should be either something to complement the dinner or a desert to be served at the party following dinner in the clubhouse. Corrinne Christensen is hosting the party with games and prizes for the best outfit and the best decorated boat. I passed out charting directions to Mitchell's Bay earlier in the year and again at Radlin's last weekend. The cut into Mitchell's Bay has 4 feet of water and is well marked. Please make your decision to come based on your boat's draft. Anyone not sure on how to get into Mitchell's Bay Marina using the charting directions can call them on channel 68 when you arrive at the XE2 red marker located in over 10 feet of water. Ray from Mitchell's Bay will meet you in a chase boat and you can follow him into the marina. Anyone still needing charting directions can either email or call me.

After Mitchell's Bay is St. Clair Boat Harbor June 23rd. There will be an art fair in St. Clair on the river walk that weekend for the art lovers. Captain Morgan will be on the docks in St. Clair so bring your pirate's gear. Not sure what we will have for dinner yet, but it will be served in the pavilion. A dish to pass will be needed. After that it will be Algonac Harbor June 30th for the Forth of July. Fireworks on the river Saturday at dusk (bring your lawn chairs), Ribs for dinner with a dish to pass on Saturday at 6:00 p.m., continental breakfast on Sunday (bring your coffee) at 10:00 a.m., dingy poker run on Sunday at 2:00 p.m. and sip-n-dip Sunday at 6:00 p.m. There was a \$40.00 per boat deposit that the club paid for everyone that signed up for the outing that will be non-refundable after June 15, 2006. We have 21 wells reserved on "T" dock. This is the same dock we were on last year. If you did not sign up and want to attend according to the sign up sheet, there is one more available well on "T" dock. Additional wells in the harbor are also available but not on "T" dock. If you signed up and will not be able to attend, let me know before as soon as possible and before June 15th to avoid being required to pay the deposit.

Lets hear it for the class of 2006!

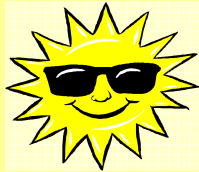

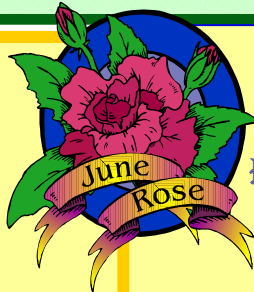
Lastly thank you Gary, and everyone that helped put on such a great outing at Radlins Good Job !
